On July 25, 1861 the US Congress passed the Crittenden-Johnson Resolution which stated: The Civil War was being waged for the reunion of the states, and not to abolish the South's "peculiar institution" of slavery.

In combination with subsequent Union Victories, the Emancipation Proclamation ended all hopes of the Confederacy for recognition from Britain and France. On August 1, 1861 Brazil officially recognized the CSA

Albert Woolson, a drummer in the Union Army, was the last Union Civil War soldier, He died in 1956 at the age of 109.

The last Confederate Veteran was Pleasant Grump, who died in 1951
